What do you need?



Measuring tape





Screwdriver



Utility knife







Wallpaper spatula















Wallpaper brush

Important before applying the wallpaper: Let the wallpaper acclimate for 24 hours. This prevents

- shrinkage in the wallpaper. The optimal wallpapering temperature is between 18–25°C
- and a humidity level of 40%-65%. Ensure the wall is clean, dry, and uniformly colored. The wall
- should also be smooth (no texture or irregularities). Plastered or new walls

- If your wall is freshly plastered, treat it with primer. New, untreated walls must be pre-treated. You can also
- choose to paint the wall with white paint. These pre-treatments help the wallpaper adhere better to the
- wall.

Preparation Turn off the power to the outlets and switches in the wall and

- remove the frames. Remove old wallpaper and ensure the wall is clean and even.
- Cover the floor with newspapers, cloths, or plastic sheets.
- Set up a sturdy ladder to press the wallpaper onto the entire
- Carefully take the wallpaper out of the box and check for any
- irregularities. Make sure the wallpaper is in order before starting to apply it.
- Tip: you get the best result if your wall has a uniform color.







Tips:

- Wallpapering around a window or other obstacle? First, place the strips entirely over it and then cut
- them piece by piece along the frame. Do not cut the entire strip to size in one go. Small air bubbles will disappear when drying. Large air bubbles can be pricked with a pin to release the
- Remove excess glue with a dry cloth. Ensure sharp folds at corners. This makes cutting away excess wallpaper easier.
